## **SELECTIVE EXPANSION**

enue at the 26-year-old company grew by 20.8% from 2016 to 2017, one of the biggest jumps on the latest Crain's list of New York's largest construction firms. This year the company is forecasting a local revenue bump of an additional 8%, even though the contractor is trying to temper its expansion in a robust market.



"There seems to be an oversupply of work at the moment," said Maurice Regan, founder and

chief executive. "We have to be selective. We can't take every job and be successful for every client. That's what gets companies in trouble. We try to take on work only when we can provide good service."

J.T. Magen has offices in Chicago and Los Angeles, but most of the firm's volume is in projects here. Of the contractor's 2017 total revenue, 81% came from metro-area work. And a significant portion of its efforts have gone into a single job: the office-to-residential conversion of **1 Wall St.**, the former Bank of New York Mellon headquarters. One of the largest conversions of a prewar building in the city, the 1 Wall St. job is contracted for approximately \$800 million over four years.

"It's maybe 15% of our business," Regan said. "What we found attractive about the project was its longevity. Most interiors projects are six months to a year in duration. Instead, we're booking work three years in advance. It's a great foundation job."


Lining up future work is particularly important now, as certain financial indicators lead Regan to believe that a downturn in the market is coming in the next two years. But the Irish ex-pat adjusted his business model in response to the last decade's boom and bust, and Regan thinks his firm is now better prepared to weather the next storm.

"We had to become more efficient and make the company a little bit larger," he said. "The company is now stronger and more diversified. Hopefully we'll be stronger than our competitors."
